EB Minute 29/18: Apologies

Apologies were noted.

## EB Minute 30/18: Expert Body Minutes

The minutes from the meeting of September 5<sup>th</sup> 2018 were agreed, subject to minor amendments.

#### EB Minute 31/18: Matters Arising

It was noted that Professor Helen Whelton had made a presentation £lobal Consensus on Unacceptable Fluorosis to Inform Fluoride Intake Decisionson the IADR 96<sup>th</sup> General Session, London, and it was agreed to invite her to present to the Expert Body.

#### EB Minute 32/18: Correspondence

Correspondence was noted. It was noted that a clear and informed response had been sent to Cork County Council regarding its motion on water fluoridation. It was further noted that there are some inaccuracies on what Councillor Diarmiad O Cadhla has stated in an article in the Evening Echo £ouncillors call for fluoridation of water to be optional

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#### EB Minute 33/18: Finance

It was noted that Secretariat Costs are within budget. It was further noted that Budget 2019 should be received in February 2019 and that required extra funding for attendance at relevant scientific conferences would be considered as part of this. Any outstanding expenses for 2018 should be submitted by 12<sup>th</sup> December.

#### EB Minute 34/18: Expert Body Structure

The structure of the Expert Body was approved.

It was agreed that Sub-Committee meetings should take place in Q1 2019. The Chairs of the Sub-Committee were proposed and agreed as follows:

It was suggested that some sub-committee meetings could be held remotely. It was noted that the Secretariat obtained information regarding online meeting services and it was agreed that Zoom is a good option for teleconferences as it reduces travel time, accidents and environmental impact.

It was noted that the first Dental Public Health Training Programme has been established by the Public Health Advisory Committee, and that a researcher/public health trainee will hold a 3 year post, it was suggested the Expert Body could be a work stream for this trainee and that the person might be co-opted onto one of the subcommittees.

#### EB Minute 35/18: Systematic Review

It was noted that the review programme Eppi Reviewer would be considered as part of the Systematic review, once the search strategy is complete. It was further noted that a site licence will be required for all Expert Body members.

It was agreed that it is important to also include the positive dental effects and positive systemic health effects in the systematic review.

Dr Brett Duane stepped out to attend another meeting.

It was agreed that precise wording is very important for the search strategy and that the question should be piloted and refined by the NEI Health Sub-Committee before the group meets. The Irish Expert Body on Fluorides and Health

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It was agreed that the Grey Literature review is still to be kept under review by the Secretariat.

It was noted that Dr Patrick Quinn would circulate his paper on Ethics and Water Fluoridation.

It was agreed to invite Professor John Coggan to make a presentation to the Expert Body regarding public ethics as it would be important for a decision making framework. The meeting broke for lunch and Dr Brett Duane returned to the meeting

#### EB Minute 36/18: Department of Health

The Chair gave a briefing of a meeting with the Department of Health regarding fluorides and the draft Oral Health Policy.

### EB Minute 37/18: Any Other Business

It was noted that media training may be required for members of the Communications Sub-Committee.

It was noted that the FAQ will be reviewed and this will be referred to the relevant subcommittee.

It was noted that Irish Water is currently considering an Asset Management Approach and that it is planned to amalgamate 500 water treatment plants into 300.

It was noted that the previous Expert Body made a submission to the Irish Water draft Lead in Drinking Water Mitigation Plan regarding Orthophosphate and had written to the HSE Drinking Water Group.

It was noted that the Secretariat would circulate the paper \(\frac{1}{2}\)When public action undermines public health: a critical examination of antifluoridationist literatureq Armfield 2007.

It was noted that the Australian Medical Association supports water fluoridation and has launched an information campaign to highlight the significant public health benefits (The Guardian 30<sup>th</sup> October 2018).
